Charleston – special anchorage area



The US Coast Guard proposes to modify the special anchorage area on the Ashley River in Charleston, South Carolina. Comments on the proposal should be submitted by 6 June. [79 Fed. Reg. 26195](#) (May 7, 2014).

FERC – Cameron Liquefaction FEIS



The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) issued a notice stating that it has prepared a final environmental impact statement (FEIS) for the Cameron Liquefaction Project in Cameron and Calcasieu Parishes, Louisiana. [79 Fed. Reg. 26244](#) (May 7, 2014).

USCG – Qualified Assessor Program



The US Coast Guard issued a **notice** discussing recent changes to the Qualified Assessor Program. The Coast Guard is now accepting applications for designation as a Qualified Assessor. (5/5/14).

USCG – use of fraudulent mariner's license



The US Coast Guard issued a **news release** stating that a man has been sentenced to seven years in prison after having pled guilty to six felony offenses including use of a fraudulent mariner's license to obtain employment operating commercial vessels on the Great Lakes. (5/6/14).

USN – RIMPAC 2014



The US Navy issued a **news release** stating that twenty-three nations, 47 ships, six submarines, more than 200 aircraft, and 25,000 personnel will participate in the biennial Rim of the Pacific (RIMPAC) exercise scheduled for 26 June through 1 August in and around the Hawaiian Islands. Two nations, Brunei and the People's Republic of China, will participate for the first time. (5/6/14).

EU – waste shipments



The Council of the European Union issued a **press release** stating that it has adopted a regulation amending regulation 1013/2006 on shipments of waste, both within the EU and between the EU and third countries. The regulation will enter into force twenty days after its publication in the EU Official Journal. It will apply from 1 January 2016. (5/6/14).
