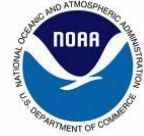
PHMSA – meeting re transport of dangerous goods



The Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) issued a notice stating that it and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) will conduct meetings on 14 June in Washington, DC to prepare for upcoming sessions of the United Nations Sub-Committee of Expert on the Transportation of Dangerous Goods and the United Nations Sub-Committee of Experts on the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and

The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) issued a corrected notice announcing the selection of projects for the **Passenger Ferry Grant Program**. These Ferry Program funds will provide financial assistance to support existing ferry service, establish new ferry service, and repair and modernize ferry boats, terminals, and related facilities and equipment. **81 Fed. Senate – bill introduced re DOD appropriations



Senator Cochran (R-MS) introduced a bill (**S. 3000**) making appropriations for the Department of Defense for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2017, and for other purposes. Among other things, the bill includes \$1 billion for construction of polar icebreakers. (5/26/16)

The Singapore Maritime and Port Authority (MPA) issued a circular stating that the SOLAS requirement concerning container verified gross mass (VGM) will be enforced in Singapore effective 1 July.
