## IMO - fuel consumption data collection

The IMO issued a news release stating that the recent session of the Marine Environment Protection Committee (MEPC 70) adopted a requirement, effective 1 March 2018, for the collection of fuel consumption and related data by ships of 5,000 gross tonnage and above. This data will be used to inform future
