Jacksonville – LNG export application

The Department of Energy (DOE) issued a notice stating that it received an application from Eagle LNG Partners Jacksonville II LLC for authorization to export domestically produced liquefied natural gas (LNG) in containers from Jacksonville. Comments on the application must be received by 4 August. 82 Fed. Reg. 31050 (7/5/17) [https://www.gpo.gov/fdsys/pkg/FR-2017-07-05/pdf/2017-14061.pdf].

DOJ – proposed consent decree

The Department of Justice (DOJ) issued a notice stating that a proposed consent decree regarding Suez Shipping North America and Hoegh Fleet Management has been filed in federal court. The proposal provides for payment by the defendants of \$1.9 million for damages resulting from the 15 December 2009 grounding of gas carrier LNGC Matthew on a coral reef on the south shore of Puerto Rico. DOT – INFRA project funding

The Department of Transportation (DOT) issued a notice stating that the Nationally Significant Freight and Highway Projects (INFRA) program provides federal financial assistance to freight and highway projects of national or regional significance. Applications for awards under FY 2017 and FY 2018 funding must be submitted by 2 November. The Grants.gov "Apply" function will open by 1 August. 82 Fed. DOE - LNG exportation

The Department of Energy (DOE) issued a news release announcing approval of two long-term applications to export additional liquefied natural gas (LNG) from the proposed Lake Charles LNG Liquefaction Project. DOJ – ro-ro shipping executives indicted

The Department of Justice (DOJ) issued a news release stating that three individuals have been indicted for participating in a long-running conspiracy to allocate certain customers and routes, rig bids, and fix prices for the sale of international ocean shipments of roll-on, roll-off cargoes to and from the United States and elsewhere. Including these individuals, eleven executives have been charged in the investigation to date. Of these, four have pleaded guilty and been sentenced to serve prison terms, while some others remain international fugitives. Black Sea - GPS interference

USMMA – accreditation report

The Maritime Administration (MARAD) issued a news release stating that the Middle States Commission on Higher Education found that the US Merchant Marine Academy (USMMA) has successfully satisfied four of five deficient standards of accreditation. The Academy retains full accreditation, yet remains in warning status until the final deficiency, related to institutional planning and resource allocation, is resolved. Representative Johnson (R-LA) introduced a bill (H.R. 3133) to amend the Marine Mammal Protection Act of 1972 to reduce unnecessary permitting delays by clarifying associated procedures to increase economic development and support coastal restoration programs, and for other purposes. Court - known loss is uninsurable

In an unpublished decision, the US Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit ruled that a known loss is uninsurable. In the instant case, plaintiff shipper purchased marine insurance for a shipment of cargo after it knew that the cargo had been hijacked. In the litigation that followed, plaintiff argued that the insurance contract was consummated because defendant insurer accepted payment of the insurance premium after it knew or should have known of the loss. In ruling for the insurer, the court found that it is contrary to public policy to allow enforcement of such an agreement. ITN Consolidators v. Court – prejudgment interest and DOHSA

In a brief unpublished decision, the US Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit held that a trial court may award prejudgment interest under the Death on the High Seas Act (DOHSA), even when the question of damages has been submitted to a jury Hill v. Majestic Blue Fisheries, No. 15-16507 (9th Cir., June 29, 2017) [http://cdn.ca9.uscourts.gov/datastore/memoranda/2017/06/29/15-16507.pdf].

IMO – Global Industry Alliance
