Court – adequacy of PWC warnings

HE NATIONAL ACADEMIES

In a diversity of citizen case and applying South Carolina law, the US Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit affirmed the district court's entry of summary judgment in favor of defendant manufacturer of a personal water craft (PWC) and against the plaintiff who was seriously injured when she fell off the PWC being operated by a 14-year-old and on which she was the fourth passenger and wearing only a bikini. Defendant had included warnings on the PWC itself and in the operator's manual that the craft should not be operated by persons under the age of sixteen, that no more than three person should ride the PWC at any time, and that all persons should wear a wet suit bottom or similar protective clothing. Plaintiff contended that the warnings were inadequate, but the warnings clearly complied with state law.
