Any submitted NOAD form utilizing Schema 3.4 after the retirement date will be rejected. The Tokyo MOU issued a [press release](#) stating that preliminary results of the concentrated inspection campaign (CIC) on safety of navigation show that member Authorities inspected 6,720 vessels, of which 36 were detained (0.54%).
