USCG - 2017 Port State Control Report

The US Coast Guard issued a bulletin stating that it has received its thirteenth application for type approval of a ballast water management system (BWMS), this one for the Aquarius EC system manufactured by Wartsila Water Systems Ltd. NASA – shipping activity in the Arctic

NASA's Earth Observatory issued a bulletin concerning how the disappearing Arctic sea ice is leading to changes in the shipping industry.

Analysis reveals that shipping activity in the Arctic has moved north and east over the past seven years, getting closer to the North Pole. GAO - USCG heavy polar icebreaker acquisition

The Government Accountability Office (GAO) issued a report on the status of the Coast Guard's heavy polar icebreaker acquisition. The acquisition program calls for construction and operation of three heavy polar icebreakers. The contract is expected to be awarded in the third quarter of fiscal year 2019 with delivery of the lead ship in 2023. GAO-18-385R (4/13/18) [https://www.gao.gov/assets/700/691260.pdf].

California – \$350,000 penalty for air emission violations

The California Air Resources Board (ARB) issued a notice stating that Mediterranean Shipping Company SA paid \$350,000 in penalties for a total of four violations of state air emission regulations by its vessels. The company has corrected the issue, and devised a thorough compliance plan going forward. (3/26/18)

IMO – climate change strategy adopted

The IMO issued a news release stating that the Marine Environment Protection Committee (MEPC 72) adopted an initial strategy on reduction of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions from ships engaged in international trade. The strategy includes a specific reference to 'a pathway of CO2 emissions reduction consistent with the Paris Agreement temperature goals'. <u>ReCAAP – first quarter report</u>

The ReCAAP Information Sharing Centre posted its Report of incident of piracy and armed robbery against ships in Asian waters during the first quarter of 2018. There were 14 reports compared to 27 reported incidents in

New Zealand – grounding on uncharted rock

The New Zealand Transport Accident Investigation Commission (TAIC) issued the report of its investigation of the grounding of the passenger vessel L'Austral on an uncharted rock in the Snares Islands on 9 January 2017 in the sub-Antarctic. While the master was distracted with other matters, the vessel drifted into an unauthorized zone and made contact with the rock, which pierced the hull.
